This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...

We found out that if it's not an even number, it can't be shared because it's odd! We also used conjunctions like 'and' and 'because' to make our sentences longer.

Reception

In maths, we've been doing multiplication and choosing whether we need a challenge, need practice or need help. We've also written poems about the dark and are rewriting the story in our own words!

Year 1
Magnolia

This week, we've been doing word sentence math challenges about multiplication, which is when we have to make a number sentence and word sentence, like $7 \times 2 = 14$ and 7 lots of 2 is 14.

Year 1
Sycamore

In English, we finished our Queen Victoria review and we've been done a maths test which was hard but interesting. We also learnt how to ask your age in German!

Year 2

We've started long multiplication which is a 3 digit number times a 2 digit number. We also made songs in music and experimented with different instruments.

Year 3

In science, we're looking at the digestive system which is more complicated than you think! We've also started dividing and multiplying with decimals like $12.12 \div 6 = 2.02$.

Year 4

We worked out the mean average in maths - you add all the items and divide by the number of items. We've also written booklets about Greek boats like the trireme.

Year 5
Willow

We've carried on our Odysseus stories from last week, and started long division: $130 \div 20$. We've drawn Greek vases in red and black, and are having a Greek day soon!

Year 5
Cherry

We've been going through our maths SATs which has been useful. In English, we're writing a story related to Wonder - we choose a character and write a fiction related to them.

Year 6

Our Sports correspondent has reported that there was an all girls 6-a-side football match held yesterday between Brindishe Lee and Brindishe Manor. It was a well fought game and our team tried their hardest but lost 2-0. However, it's OK because they tried their best!
