It considers what to talk about with your children as they begin to make their first journeys out without you. I hope it is helpful.

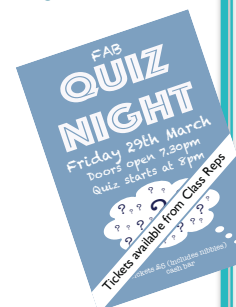

This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...

This week, we learned that lifeboats save people from drowning. We had a visit from someone who works in a lifeboat and saves actual lives! She was a super hero but left her cape in her car!

Reception

In maths, we learnt that multiplication is the same as repeated addition, so $2+2+2=3\times 2$. It's also commutative which means you can swap the numbers without changing the calculation like $3\times 2=2\times 3$.

Year 1
Magnolia

We've been using arrays to do multiplication - that's when you use dots or stickers to show 3×2 . We also used personification and adverbs (words that describe verbs) to write stories about the dark.

Year 1
Sycamore

We wrote a background to Queen Victoria - she painted the railings of London black to mourn her husband, Albert? We also discovered that humans are the deadliest animal!

Year 2

In English, we wrote a poem about flotsam - the things that wash up on the beach. We also looked at different religions, their symbols and their places of worship.

Year 3

We made posters about why the rainforest is important and should be protected. For example, birds migrate there. In maths, we did addition and subtraction using decimals like $2.3-1.75$.

Year 4

We did an investigation into quadrilaterals - shapes with four sides. We also wrote articles about Lord Elgin stealing Greek marbles to save them from ruin.

Year 5
Willow

At the end of *The Odyssey*, Tiresias hints at a second adventure and we're writing it! We've also started long multiplication involving numbers past 12.

Year 5
Cherry

This week, we've been doing mock SATs in grammar & spelling, reading and maths, and we now feel fully prepared and confident! As long as you put your mind to it, it's doable!

Year 6

Our Sports Correspondent reports that last week, Brindishe Lee competed in a friendly tournament: we were nervous, but after a 3-0 victory, we had confidence in ourselves. Our second match was a 0-0 draw against our rivals, Brindishe Manor. Our last match was also tight but fortunately, our striker was in a one-on-one situation and put it through the legs of the keeper. After that, the results came in... and Brindishe Lee finished 1st!
