

This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...

We learnt that a butterfly lays eggs under a leaf so the birds can't eat them. A caterpillar pokes out and eats lots of food! A cocoon goes round and round and they shed their skin. It cracks out into a butterfly that can fly.
