#### Online Safety message... WhatsApp

WhatsApp is one of the most popular messaging apps in the world with a reported 1.5 billion people using it to send and receive texts, photos, videos and documents. Its free, encrypted and allows for group chats where many people can share messages, video and images instantly. The app,

#### however, has an age restriction of

**16+.** This is because it can be difficult for children to manage the risks involved with instant messaging, especially when in large groups. The app also has a 'live location' feature, where they can share their exact location instantly, however, this can also mean they can expose their location to strangers. We would strongly urge you to monitor your child's activity on WhatsApp, as this can cause unnecessary angst for children, especially when it is misused.

# An important message from Ms Doran (AWSO lead) and Mr Baguley...

We know how important good attendance is for each child's learning and progress at Brindishe Schools. We want to work with our families to achieve this. Good attendance is 96% or higher. You can check on your own child's attendance by logging into Arbor's Parent Portal using your unique login details. You can help your child have good attendance by making sure they are in school every day in term time, that they are well and by not taking holiday during term time or adding on days to the start or end of a holiday period.

• Holidays: there are already 13 weeks of the year given over to holidays and therefore a holiday taken during term time will not be authorised.

• Exceptional Circumstances: there may be occasions where, due to exceptional circumstances, you need to request a term time absence. To do this you must complete a request form in advance. Request forms are available from the school office. Our Attendance Policy details the kinds of circumstances for which we will consider authorising an absence during term time. Please ask Clare Doran, our AWSO, for details.

• Medical Needs: some children with more serious medical conditions may need to attend appointments during the school day. These absences are always authorised and we keep copies of appointment letters on the child's file. Where possible we ask that you make routine doctor or dentist check-up appointments outside of school hours. Should your child's attendance fall below 96%, we will monitor any absences and will ask to meet with you should we not see any improvement. If you have any questions regarding your child's attendance at school, please speak to me, to Clare Doran (our AWSO) or to Ms Matthews
