What has been happening this week?

This week one of our Year 6 classes visited The Garden Museum in Southwark as part of their learning on climate change. The children had a fabulous time and found it really informative! Thank you for the parents that supported the visit. Escher Class are very excited to attend the Museum on Monday and are hoping it stays dry for them!

This week a group of children visited The Houses of Parliament for a guided tour. The children learned about democracy, governance and the political system. They also explored various parts of Westminster Palace including The Lord's Chamber where they saw the Sovereign's Throne and Westminster Hall (the oldest part of The Houses of Parliament - 1000 years old). The children entered Westminster Palace through the Sovereign's Entrance which is exclusively used by the Monarch.

This week the children were introduced to the musician Stevie Wonder and how he overcome his disability to become a talented pianist and singer. The children enjoyed listening to some of his music and learning about how the song 'Happy Birthday' came about, through the Civil Rights movement.
