I would speak to Miss Porter.</li> <li>• At lunch or break I could speak to an adult on the playground, my teacher in class, a deputy head teacher or the head teacher</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All 237 children who responded could give at least one person they would speak to.</li> <li>• We hold regular assemblies to remind children about who their trusted adults are in school.</li> <li>• We run NSPCC assemblies and PSHME lessons to talk about adult support in school.</li> <li>• ELSA sessions and friendship groups run for children</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They give you time to have some space and we do PSHME lessons.</li> <li>• They let us talk about how we feel and in year 6 we can journal.</li> <li>• By using zones of regulation and assembly's about it</li> <li>• We talk about mental health in PSHEM lessons and in assemblies and also about how to be healthy.</li> <li>• We can put a lollipop stick in the zones of regulations tubs, telling an adult how I feel.</li> <li>• They encourage us by helping us talk about our emotions.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children have assemblies throughout the year to support understanding about mental health.</li> <li>• Children have worry boxes in classrooms, zones of regulation displays and reading material in classes.</li> <li>• We celebrate children's mental health week and send communication to parents about how to support their child at home.</li> <li>• Use our ELSA to provide more whole class themes for teachers to use throughout the year.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children listed a whole range of subject areas and themes that included maths, DT, Computing, PE and Science.</li> <li>• I enjoyed Juniper Hall, the residential because it gave the two classes a chance to know each other better than before.</li> <li>• Making pop-up books in DT</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children enjoy a whole range of subject areas throughout the school.</li> <li>• Children enjoy memorable extra-curricular activities like trips and visits and we hope to plan more of these next year for children to experience.</li> </ul>
