Online Safety Bulletins

What do I do if my child sees something inappropriate online? Being online is a great tool, however, sometimes children may suddenly be exposed to inappropriate material. If this occurs, it is important not to overreact if your child tells you about something they have seen. It is positive that they have turned to you as a trusted adult. You may feel a mix of emotions, e.g. shock or anger, however, by dealing with it calmly your child will know they can turn to you again.

NHS Flu Vaccination

You may be aware that the NHS is currently aiming to give all Reception to Year 7 children the Flu vaccination from October to December 2020. The date allocated for Brindishe Lee Primary School is **Thursday 12th November 2020**.

We are now inviting parents/guardians to register your consent for the flu vaccination. We have developed a secure on-line link that you can use to register consent for your child to be vaccinated at school. The process is quick and easy to use.

Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will help to protect them from getting the flu, and prevent it spreading among more vulnerable family and friends. With COVID-19 in circulation it is more important than ever to reduce the number of people becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them and the NHS. The vaccination is free and in most cases is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year otherwise they won't be protected. The healthcare team and school will follow guidelines to ensure your child is safe from COVID-19 while getting the vaccine.
